Open House PTM is being conducted at Shanti International School Unjha

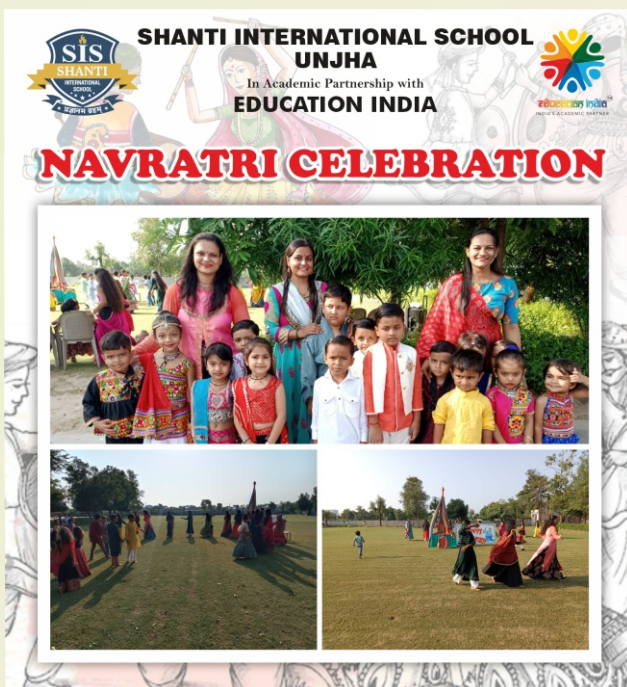

Throughout the day students participated in many activities related to the festival: Rangoli making, Diya decoration, Painting and Greeting Card Making.

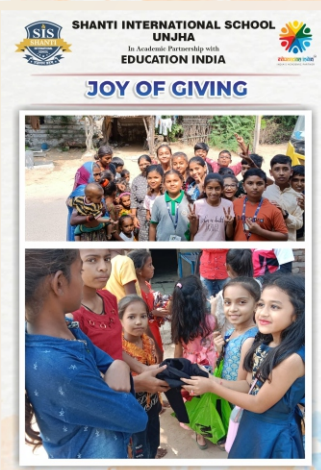
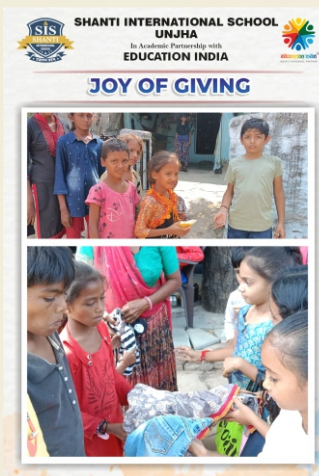
Wishing you all a Happy Diwali!!! May you all walk the path of success and prosperity with the blessings of Lord Ganesh and Goddess Laxmi!!
